A few words from Patron, Peg Hargreaves....

To President Denise, Committee and lady members

As your Patron, it gives me great pleasure to have this opportunity to say—thank you for your get well messages during the past year. You helped me to climb a few mountains.

My golfing days, came to a close in 2017 because of a shoulder injury; I regretfully hung my clubs up. However, during the time I was a member, I dedicated my time to being active in raising funds for our special Open Days. I was prepared for my donors with an introductory letter from the Committee for when I approached the retailers in The Boulevarde shopping area. As I introduced myself, I felt the warmth and interest in their support for the Ladies Golf Club and we promoted each business on those days. I walked many miles—did you know that The Boulevarde is quite steep?? BUT, I was fit and younger then. Each year, I would refer to my walk as "The Boulevarde Beat".

Your past Patron, Melva Henry, who stayed with us until 108 years of age, was a foundation member of the original 9 Hole Golf Club at Kilaben Bay in the 1950's. It was in the 1950's that I became a member of Kilaben Bay Golf Club. I played golf with Melva and other dedicated members. It was a time when I fell in love with the area and for the past 46 years have lived near the original Kilaben Bay Golf course—looking so different then to what it does today.

So many wonderful memories of how dedicated the Ladies Committee was and the support they gave when moving to the course we use today. And proudly I can say—is still happening today. My role now as your Patron and reflecting on how much I have learned—and still learning.

I recall in 1982, I was a Ladies Fashion Retailer in Blackbutt Shopping area, in Orchardtown Road, New Lambton. The shopping centre was in walking distance to Blackbutt Reserve. I was approached by Blackbutt Reserve Ranger's wife, Janet Raesbeck. Janet and husband, Ray Raesbeck, lived in a house within Blackbutt Reserve. Ray was a Council employee. Janet was not, allowing her to discuss her concerns regarding changes that Newcastle City Council had for Blackbutt Reserve.

Newcastle City Council was making moves to remove all animals from Blackbutt Reserve. Carnley Ave was a newly constructed access road from Charlestown Rd to Orchardtown Rd through to Bridges Rd. Koalas have a direct path from one area to another and unfortunately Carnley Ave was part of their path. So many koalas and other wildlife were injured and killed. Janet and Ray Raesbeck set up a shed behind the house to tend to the injured and many survived. This continued for many years.

Janet's mission to me was to ask for my help to form a committee. Information relating to the removal of the animals was advertised and the response from the public was that the animals were not to be removed. A committee was formed, named and registered as Blackbutt Reserve Support Group Inc. I was elected President with a dedicated committee which lasted 10 years.

During these years many public access meetings we attended in Newcastle Council Chambers, till midnight on many occasions. The Councillors listened intently, not all agreed, but our solid presentation of 30,000 signatures from Newcastle and Hunter Valley residents was successful. To this day, Blackbutt Reserve belongs to the citizens of Newcastle. Newcastle City Council is the carer. A safe area for families to enjoy with their young children.

It was then and now, I realise I am just an ordinary person with extraordinary determination—to continue caring and sharing and enjoying the wonderful chain of friendships that you, my golfing friends, have given to me.

## NULLARBOR LINKS

Nullarbor Links is the longest golf course in the world, spanning 1365 kilometres between Ceduna in South Australia and Kalgoorlie in Western Australia. Each of its 18 holes is located at a participating town or roadhouse along the Eyre Highway. Each hole includes a green and tee, and a somewhat rugged outback-style natural terrain fairway. Since it opened in 2009, more than 20,000 people have played the par 72 course, some repeatedly.

The Nullarbor Links concept was developed to complement and enhance the tourism industry along the Highway, encouraging travellers to spend more time and money in the region. It involved the collaboration of four local government shires, the existing golf courses along the route (Ceduna, Eucla, Norseman, Kambalda, Kalgoorlie) and the owners of roadhouses along the Eyre Highway who developed a golf hole for inclusion in the Nullarbor Links—Penong, Nundroo, Nullarbor, Border Village, Eucla, Mundrabilla, Madura Pass, Cocklebiddy, Caiguna, Balladonia, Fraser Range.

To play the course, participants purchase a score card from Ceduna, Norseman or Kalgoorlie Visitor Centres for a cost of \$78 per person. As they travel the Highway, players complete each hole and stamp their card. Holes include the par 3 Skylab at Balladonia named for the famously doomed space probe which crash landed nearby in 1979, the par 4 Nullarbor Nymph, the challenging par 5 Dingo's Den at the Nullarbor Motel and the 4th hole called Wombat, in honour of the local marsupial inhabitants who make up what is said to be the world's largest population of Hairy Nosed Wombats. After completing all holes and showing their card at a visitor centre, players receive a certificate.

Earlier in the year, Chris Frederiks visited and played golf with us from Wynnum GC in Queensland. Chris has recently played the Chasing the Sun Golf Tournament on the Nullarbor Links and sent these photos. Chris and her partners won the 9 hole Ambrose competition as part of the Nullarbor adventure.
